Congratulations to all umpires who achieved their goals during the year, from Grand Final appointments, A.F.L. and representative games and to everyone who contributed in the progress of the Association.

Finally, special mention must be made of two members who will not be with us in 1992. John Reid and Martin Jackson have returned to Hobart and Melbourne respectively. John became Life Member in 1989 and Martin in 1991 which indicates the type of contributions they have made to the Association. With a total of 15 First Grade Grand Finals between them, the experience will be sorely missed. Furthermore Martin's five years as Treasurer has placed the Association on solid ground. The numerous umpires who have benefited from John and Martin's experience can be eternally grateful.

In closing, the momentum of 1991 must continue for Sydney Football to develop. It is up to each and everyone of us to ensure such development.
