It is most important that all umpires give support to CUB by wearing the company's logo on their equipment to give suitable exposure earned by their generous assistance. Buffalo Sports assisted all umpires by their keeness to provide all umpires with their uniforms, jackets and shirts, and this is gratefully acknowledged.

I would like to thank all members of the 1992 Board of Directors for their support given during the season; especially to David Yole as Secretary and to Mark Rendell. David will be unable to continue as Secretary in 1993 due to his new positon as Sydney Junior Umpires Development Co-ordinator. David will be sadly missed as his contribution over the last few years has been essential to the advancement of the Association. Mark regained a position on the Board after having a year off to add 13 years valuable experience to the management of football umpiring in NSW.

During the season a number of social events were held which highlighted the continued spirit within the ranks. The best attended were the Grand Final Night and the President's Evening where in excess of ninety people attended both functions. The Board decided to place special emphasis on the Grand Final Night this year as it was considered that this presentation function should be the pinnacle of the season; where umpires obtain their reward for a year of hard work. The support given by Members to this function clearly evidenced the support for the decision.

In closing, congratulations to all umpires who achieved their personel goals during the hard year and look forward to 1993 as further development in umpiring in Sydney.
