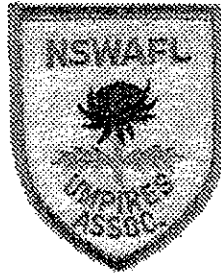

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The 1993 football season must be considered as the breakthrough year for umpiring in Sydney.

Umpiring/Refereeing any sport requires a number of qualities, not the least of which is ambition. I am sure all members desire to be the best umpire they can and perform at the highest level within their capabilities. The major breakthrough made during 1993 was the first appointment at senior AFL level of a Sydney based field umpire. Congratulations Gerald Walsh on such a strong commitment to high performance. Another to reach the same standard was goal umpire Phil Goss. Both men show what can be achieved and it is hoped Sydney umpiring can now provide many more numbers being appointed to the national list.

Overall the Association produced a further increase on numbers of the previous year that certainly continued to show umpiring in a very professional light and is a compliment to each member of Association.

The departure for higher duties in Melbourne of David Levens comes at a time when a solid structure for the future has been put in place. David was the first to recognise the need to document a plan for umpiring development and his blueprint has now been adopted nationally as part of a complete "Five Year Plan." Special thanks to David for all his work over the past five years and good luck with the elite AFL list. A warm welcome to Sydney for David's replacement Keith Ogston. The Association looks forward to working closely with Keith during 1994.

The support team of Max Henry, David Stuckey, Terry Godfrey and Ken Ray provided excellent service to the group and ensured each umpire had the opportunity to perform at their best.

The Association was again fortunate to have financial support from Carlton and United Breweries, Buffalo Sports, Diadora and Tony McGilvary through Traveland Hurstville. This assistance is gratefully acknowledged and the association looks forward to further help during 1994.

I would like to thank all members of the 1993 Board of Directors for their work during the year. The executive positions of Secretary and treasurer were taken over by Nick Angelos and Henry Harrop, both new to these roles and handled with a great deal of distinction. It was refreshing to have new faces on the Board in Kevin Meade and Gerald Walsh. These two gentlemen added considerable experience. Grant Godfrey and Mark Rendell again worked tirelessly for the Association.

During any football season, disagreement will always occur on week by week appointments and the design of Tuesday/Thursday fitness sessions. Those umpires who believe they were discriminated against in not being appointed to what they consider their correct levels of football each week or missed out on a Grand Final, need to individually search for reasons behind their disappointment. It is difficult with such a large group to please everyone

but umpiring is all about performing and accepting decisions made by the UAB. Those who feel disappointed must look to 1994 as a challenge to prove their value and focus on high personal goals. The umpire group trained for a total of 36 weeks during 1993 and sessions were always of a high standard. Those umpires who feel training was too difficult or that some sessions were not correctly structured, must realise that fitness is an essential ingredient of any good umpire and the training programme is always designed to ensure umpires perform at their best.

Good luck to all members in 1994. The Association must always be a positive force in Sydney football to maintain a strong professional image.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The highlight of the 1993 season for most people associated with Sydney umpiring was the appointment of one of our member, Gerald Walsh, as a field umpire to an AFL match. This honour in many ways over-shadowed another very successful season for our Association.

A common measure of our Association's success is the number of appointments filled each week and who made AFL or VSFL level. While our umpires did well in both these areas, the personal development of all our colleagues and the strength of our Association more accurately reflects our performance.

Many umpires achieved or surpassed the goals they set at the start of 1993. In most cases this was a reflection of their dedication and commitment to umpiring, coupled with a willingness to improve. The positive attitude shown by most of our colleagues on the training track and at games provided the support which made this possible.

The umpiring environment is further enhanced by the efforts of members who contributed their own time to assisting others. Most notable was the work of Kevin Meade, Grant Godfrey and Nevill Sowter behind the bar/canteen after training on Thursday nights.

Many others deserve recognition for their efforts. The time put in by some members of the Association including Harvey (Steve) Wallbank with bottles of water, David Yole as Junior Umpires Co-ordinator and Henry Harrop as Treasurer, was quite significant.

While it is hard to go past the generosity of Tony McGilvray in donating a trip for two to the Gold Coast as an award, it is important to acknowledge those who offered lifts to fellow umpires, loaned old uniforms and assisted

in junior matches. Thanks also to Tim Shearer who helped to establish our contact with Diadora.

Our fitness coach, David Stuckey, deserves praise for trying to develop a training programme for 50 different umpires with different levels of fitness, natural ability, ambition and desire to train. It is also promising to hear he will return in 1994.

The dedication of many of umpires at training is highly commendable. Ray Pearce, Kevin Meade, Henry Harrop, Mike Heinrichs and Phil Goss among others travelled long distances to regularly attend training whilst some including Eileen Baker, Keith Angelo and Harvey are always there struggling to improve their fitness.

Many of our colleagues were rewarded during the season for their efforts by umpiring in higher grades. For some, such as Peter Morcom, it was rapid rise to SFL seniors, while others like Scott Gilbert, Mike Heinrichs, John Suter, Michael Forbes and Grant Godfrey were rewarded with VSFL matches after years of hard work. Phil Goss, after reaching AFL senior level early in 1993, did remarkable well to hold his place for the rest of the season and umpire before 55,000 at the MCG.

All the umpires who represented our Association at carnivals, championships and on exchanges performed well. Michael Forbes travelled to Adelaide for Teal Cup, Tim Shearer to Melbourne for the Australian Schoolboys (umpiring the final) and Steve Wallbank went to the Sapphire Coast for the Country Championships. Frank Kalayzich, Peter Hampshire and Andrew Smith were selected to represent Sydney at the NSW State Championships in Leeton.

The number of exchanges and coaching trips increased significantly in 1993, with members travelling to Canberra, Wagga Wagga, Merimbula, Broken Hill, Bathurst and the Far North Coast. These can only help improve the standard of umpiring throughout NSW whilst providing a small reward for our members.

I would like to congratulate all members who made their debut at higher grades, represented our Association or were appointed to a Grand Final in 1993. These are some of the rewards for the hard work put in over many years. It is unfortunate that we cannot all attain one of these distinctions every year.

News of the retirement of Max Henry as Sydney Umpires' Coach and Mark Rendell was a sad note at the end of 1993 season. I am sure all our members are indebted to Max for his work in umpiring and are pleased to hear that he will still be involved in umpiring in some capacity.

The loss of Mark Rendell from the senior panel will be considerable. His years of experience as a member of the Executive and as an umpire have made him a well respected figure in our ranks.

Mark's contribution to umpiring includes the development of four umpires from junior football on the North Shore to VSFL level, in addition to umpiring

more than 300 senior SFL matches. Whilst he will not be running senior football in 1994, his experience will be invaluable for umpire coming through the ranks.

On a more positive note, our congratulations are extended to our State Director of Umpiring, David Levelns who has been appointed AFL Umpires' Coach. Since his arrival in 1989 there have been many changes in Sydney umpiring most of which are the result of David's tireless work. I am sure we are all better umpires for the experience and the tremendous infrastructure David has established can only assist us further.

David's replacement, Keith Ogston faces the challenge of building upon the work that has been done to improve umpiring throughout the state. I am sure we all welcome Keith and we wish him well.

In conclusion, I would like to thank all members of the Association who helped to make 1993 a successful season. It is important we continue to work together within the Association to achieve our goals, encourage others to improve and promote football in Sydney.

It would be remiss of me to not include a list of those umpires who were recognised by their peers and received awards on Grand Final night in a review of the 1993 season.

10. The Directors are unaware of any circumstances not otherwise dealt in the Report or the Accounts which would render any amount stated in the Accounts misleading.

END OF SEASON TRIP REPORT
