PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Season 1998 was an extremely difficult year for eveyone involved within the Sydney umpiring fraternity.

The chronic shortage of umpires af all disciplines led to unnecessary measures being taken in an attempt to fullfil weekly appointments. The effort and dedication of all concerned is truly commendable and Sydney football owes all involved a vote of thanks and appreciation.

The year 1998 saw the presentation of the report of the AFL Task Force on NSW/ACT football, and in its findings umpiring was certainly featured. Mr John Livy has been appointed as the Chief Executive Officer of the AFL (NSW/ACT).

I have met John on a number of ocassions and have had preliminary discussions regarding the future of umpiring. He had expressed a committment to recruitment, retention and development of umpiring within Sydney and throughout NSW and the ACT. This can only be viewed in a positive manner, as any initiatives which result in more umpires being discovered and developed will lead to less pressure on existing members.

Reflecting on the year, certain events occured which were both positive and negative in respect to the Association. On the positive side of the ledger:

- * the appointment of Michael Heinrichs to officiate in the 1998 AFL Grand Final and subsequently the exhibition match in London.
- * as mentioned, the extreme dedication of all our members which displays an unselfish enthusiasm to our sport.
- * the professional attitude on and off the football field of all our members.
- * the appearance of Mr Bill Harrigan, National Rugby League's number 1 referee at training and speaking at the SFA Grand Final Ap-

pointments evening.

- * the committment by Nicholas Angelos to ensure the smooth operation of our Association.
- * the appointments of George Acland, Brian Woodhead, Brian Horan and Andrew Pearson to their respective Grand Finals in their first year.
- * the dedication and enthusiasm of many of our umpires, in particular Ian Mineall, Peter Nilson, Tony Unterholzer and Steve Wallbank.
- * the immense efforts and skill of David Proctor in establishing the NSWAFUA web site (<<www.nswafua.umpires.com>>)
- * David Jacobs' professional acceleration and awards of The Mark Rendell Shield (Best First Year umpire) and Trainer's Award.
 - * once again, the wonderful turnout for the Christmas function.
 - * the support of the Board of Directors in 1998. Thank you.

On the negative side of the ledger:

- * the lack of numbers in umpiring which forces us all to work harder and do more.
 - * the on-going view that you must live in Melbourne to suceed.
- * the lack of support from some members at some social functions.

All this taken into account, I am as President proud of the performance of the Board and of all members of our Association and firmly believe that 1999 will again see a professional and strong display in umpiring in Sydney football.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Looking back on 1998 most umpires will reflect upon a season that tested their commitment to football.

The members of the Association who umpired more than one game each week on a regular basis are to be commended for their dedication to football. Without this level of commitment many games would have been officiated by club umpires, an unsatisfactory situation for a game that is looking to grow in Sydney. Without properly trained umpires, players will become disenchanted and lost to football in the long term.

However, this level of dedication places extreme pressure on all umpires, each of whom have commitments including families and friends. Passive recruitment in recent years has seen numbers slip dramatically, with most 'new' umpires expatriates who have relocated to Sydney after learning their craft interstate. This has masked a serious decline in local umpire recruitment and development.

Recruitment, development and retention need to be urgently addressed by the newly formed AFL (NSW/ACT) and given a significantly higher priority than the old NSWAFL. A look at the senior SFL umpires in 1998 shows most are over 30, and did not start umpiring in Sydney. There are few up-and-coming umpires placing pressure on these umpires.

Another matter of significance is the lack of a career path for umpires who show potential in New South Wales. The promotion of umpires to AFL ranks should be based on performance and umpires should not be expected to move to achieve a higher level of training or appointment, without a level of security similar to that offered to players.

With the resources that are available to the AFL, umpires with ability should not be expected to move to Melbourne to further their career. Those umpires who choose to live and work interstate should be supported and promoted on merit.

It is unfortunate that a number of umpires have retired in recent years due to this and the issue needs to be addressed to ensure that umpiring does not become the weak link in growth of football in this State.

As the introduction of the Sydney Premier League in 1999 offers new opportunities for players, it should also promote umpiring. As the AFL now views Sydney as a breeding ground for players (6 NSW players were drafted in the November 1998 draft), it should also see it as a source of umpires for all disciplines in what should be a truly national competition.

While we all love our footy, umpiring should be about equity both on and off the field. And without the proper development of umpiring, the AFL will not get the quality footballers it is looking for in Sydney.

From a more positive prospective, Mike Heinrichs' achievements in being appointed as emergency goal umpire for the 1998 AFL Grand Final was a fantastic reward for an umpire who has applied himself to his trade in recent years. The added bonus of umpiring an international challenge match in London rounded off a fantastic year for Mike.

My lasting memories of 1998 are the strength of character shown by those umpires who confronted the challenges presented to them, and the comaraderie of the Association. The changes that we will confront in 1999 will further test the resolve of umpires.

The competition is conducted over a week with games on Sunday Wednesday and Saturday between State teams in three divisions, Superules, Seniorules and Masterules. NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the accounts preparation requirements of the Constitution of the New South Wales Australian Football Umpires Association Incorporated. The Directors have determined that the Association is not a Reporting Entity and that the Association's financial statements are not subject to the application of Accounting Standards and other professional reporting requirements, nor have these been applied, save to the extent that the accounts have been prepared in a consistent manner to previous years.

These statements are presented on an accruals basis from the records of the Association. They are based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current values of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which have been consistent with prior periods unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the presentation of these statements;

(a) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower cost and net realisable value.

(b) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax due to the application of the principal of mutuality.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Association de-corporatised during the year, reverting solely to an Incorporated Association pursuant to the NSW Associations Incorporation Act 1981. It has been recognised by the Board that registration as a company was only required if the Association had operations outside the state of NSW. Clearly it does not, and deregistration was carried out in order to relieve the Association of the additional statutory requirements and costs that corporatisation imposed. Members should note that the Association has at all times been an incorporated Association. There are no practical consequences of this move, and all members rights, privileges, property and security is unaffected.

The Association recorded a modest loss for the year of \$902.15. Features of this result include:

*The Association's general revenue streams have been strengthened by improved relations with the League. The Association benefitted from extra sponsorship revenue, and the finals trainer costs were paid by the League. Such measures have enabled members subscriptions to remain unaltered for over three years, whilst maintaining the Association's financial stability.

*The Association's equipment store was burgled, resulting in the loss of stock with a value estimated at \$3,500.00. Additionally, obsolete stock with a value estimated at \$500.00 was given away for junior Associations use.

*The Association is still owed monies by The East Sydney Australian Football Club for members services rendered preseason. These monies are been pursued by the Board.

*The Association was able to deliver better quality and more frequent members functions.

No matters of circumstance have arisen since the end of the financial year which have significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the Association, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the Association in subsequent financial years.

No director has received or become entitled to receive, during or since the financial year, a benefit because of a contract made by the Association with a director, a firm of which the director is a member, or an entity in which a director has a substantial interest

The Association has not, during or since the financial year in respect of any person who is or has been an officer or auditor of the Association:

-indemnified or made any relevant agreement for indemnifying against a liability, including costs and expenses in successfully defending legal proceedings; or

-paid or agreed to pay a premium in respect of a contract insuring against a liability for the costs or expenses to defend legal proceedings.
