

#### President's Report

I move now to the single most outstanding achievement – Michael Heinrichs – umpiring State of Origin followed by the AFL Senior Grand Final, an incredible achievement from a non Melbourne based umpire.

Congratulations once again on your season 99, - but how the hell can you go better in 2000??

To all my fellow board members thank you for your support and assistance and the professional manner in which you all went about the business of looking after the Associations best interests, a job well done yet again.

I trust that everyone has had a safe and enjoyable Christmas and New Year and that by now you are all raring to go and cant wait for the footy to commence.

I welcome David Yole back as coach and Peter Hampshire as fitness coach for the year, we are fortunate to have the calibre of these guys available for our use in Sydney.

I also pay a particular welcome to Craig Davis who has already made a huge impact on umpiring. Craig only knows one way and he will work tirelessly to better and improve every facet of umpiring for all of us involved in umpiring.

I wish all a successful season, I encourage all to be supportive of each other both on and off the field and I would ask everyone to be supportive of the Association, particularly in attending social outings that are organised, these few things will make all of us enjoy our footy more.

## Secretary's Report

There were three events during the 1999 Sydney football season, that I feel should be recorded as being the most significant moments in a tempestuous year for the Association.

The first occurred early in the season with the appointment of Mark Rendell to his 350<sup>th</sup> first grade game in the Sydney Football League/Sydney AFL. This achievement marks a monumental contribution to Australian football in this State and it is easy to understand why Mark is a life member of the Sydney Football League and our Association.

Mark's position in the Sydney football community is reflected in the respect that the players and officials of the Balmain and Campbelltown clubs gave to him on the day of the 350<sup>th</sup> game. It is also notable that Bill Barratt of the Campbelltown club took the time to produce a video of the game for Mark to keep as a memento.

Not long after, the Association lost one of its life members when Frank Nevill passed away. Frank was a long serving member of the Association, who had also served as president.

During his career, Frank achieved a first grade grand final and was selected for representative matches. He also devoted considerable effort to the development of umpiring, assisting Mark Rendell with the running of the North Shore junior association.

While Frank's passing was a sad moment for the Association, I am sure that everybody who knew him will have a memory to carry with them. For me, I remember Frank as somebody who took the time to provide guidance during my days as junior umpire on the North Shore, was a colleague when I became a senior umpire and most recently an observer.

I think it is fitting that our new honour board for grand final umpires is named after Frank and I am sure that almost everybody whose name appears on the board has fond memories of Frank.

The third significant event was the appointment of Mike Heinrichs to the 1999 AFL Grand Final. Mike was the emergency goal umpire for the 1998 grand final and also officiated in the 1999 State of Origin game.

Mike's achievement is a reflection of his attitude and commitment to umpiring. He is supportive of his colleagues and most importantly he is very good at what he does. I am sure that Saturday 25 September 1999 is a day he will never forget.

Each of these events is significant in that they involve people who have made a long-term commitment to Australian football in Sydney. At the same time, they have also freely devoted their time to helping the Association and encouraging others to achieve their goals.

# NSW AUSTRALIAN FOOTBALL UMPIRES ASSOCIATION Inc Notes to and forming part of the Accounts as at 31 December 1999

#### NOTE 1 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the requirements of the Constitution of the New South Wales Australian Football Umpires Association Inc. The Directors of the Association have determined that the Association is not a Reporting Entity and that the Association's financial statements are not subject to the application of Accounting Standards and other professional reporting requirements, nor have these been applied, save to the extent that the accounts have been prepared in a consistent manner to previous years.

The statements are presented on an accruals basis from the records of the company. They are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current values of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which have been consistent with prior periods unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the presentation of these statements;

#### (a) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### (b) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax due to the application of the principle of mutuality.

# Treasurers Report

The Association recorded a modest loss for the year of \$114.78. Features of this result include;

- \* The Associations general revenues during the year were strengthened by more aggressive pursuit of Association memberships, continued good relations with the League, and increased revenues from raffles and fundraising
- \* The Association's stocks of shirts, shorts and socks will be unable to derive future revenues that the Association has become accustomed to, due to the provision of uniforms by the AFL sponsors in Season 2000. The Association will continue to market polo and chambre shirts, and other ancillary items such as whistles, which provide an income stream for the Association thereby relieving the pressure on member fees. The Board believes that the recording of stock at cost represents a fair value, as we expect to be able to continue to supply some country umpire groups with their equipment requirements.
- \* The Association continued its policy to deliver better quality and more frequent members functions.
- \* The Association purchased member amenities including tables for the meeting room, and a Grand Final Honour Board recognising those umpires who have achieved the ultimate honour available in Sydney.

The ongoing operation of the Association and its level of membership fees will be significantly affected by some factors that are expected to occur in Season 2000. The first of these is the provision by the AFL of certain uniform items, which will impact on the Association's ability to derive income from equipment sales. Second, is the proposed diversion of practice match fees from the Association to officiating umpires. This has been brought about by the structure of the pre-season competition and pressure from some members to do so. Both measures will lead to a marked increase in membership subscription levels if the Association is to deliver to its members the quality of services and functions that occurred in 1999. Members should of course, be aware that despite this, umpires will be considerably better off by expenditure relief of not needing to purchase uniforms, and the additional income from practice matches. The expected effects of the GST are outlined below.

No director has received or become entitled to receive, during or since the financial year, a benefit because of a contract made by the Association with a director, a firm of which the director is a member, or an entity in which a director has a substantial financial interest

The Association has not, during or since the financial year, in respect of any person who is or has been an officer or auditor of the Association;

- indemnified or made any relevant agreement for indemnifying against a liability, including costs and expenses in successfully defending legal proceedings; or
- paid or agreed to pay a premium in respect of a contract insuring against a liability for the costs or expenses to defend legal proceedings.

Goods and Services Tax

Members will no doubt be aware that a Goods and Services Tax will be introduced on 1 July 2000. The following summarises the effect that the Board expects the GST will have on the Association's operations.

- \* The Association is not required to register for GST and at this stage does not propose to do so.
- \* As a result, the Association will not per se charge GST on it's memberships or goods and services provided however, the Association will be required to pay GST on the goods and services it purchases.
- \* Savings will be obtained from the abolition of wholesale sales tax on some items, after which GST will be applied.
- \* The cost of functions, being not subject to sales tax, will bear the biggest increase. This is a major item of Association expenditure.
- \*The effect of the GST will, of course, need to be passed on in membership subscriptions.

On a personal note, I extend my thanks to all members for their support during what was an exciting time for me at the end of last season. I can only look forward to more umpires from NSW aspiring to and reaching the pinnacle of umpiring, and that such drive and success will unite the Association's members for the good of football in this city.
