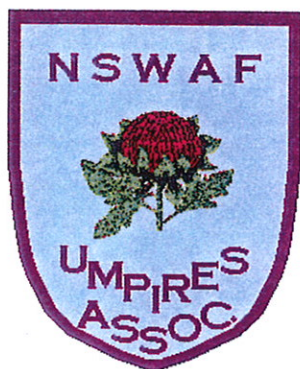
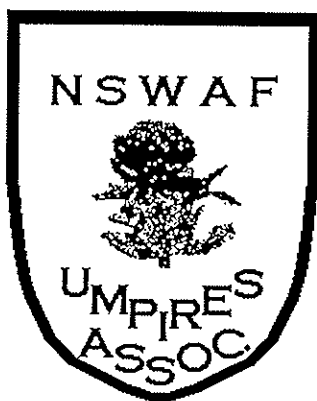

## End of Season Trip Report

While the lads were assembling at the dog kennel, Filthy rang from the airport to advise that their flight to Adelaide had been cancelled, but that they could catch an earlier flight. No panic, merely the worlds fastest trip to Mascot from bulldog land.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2000

Acting Treasurer's Report to the Members  
for the year ended 31 December 2000

I present to members the attached Interim Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2000.

Preparation of these statements has been hampered by,

- (1) Misappropriation of Funds by the former Treasurer
- (2) The loss/disappearance of the Association's cheque book
- (3) The disappearance or otherwise of most of the supporting documentation for payments.
- (4) The failure of the Associations bankers to provide timely assistance in tracing transactions

Many payments have been identified from copy cheques provided by the bank. In some instances the payee is known, however the nature of the payments cannot be recalled.

Cash receipts appeared to have been written for most cash and cheques received, however there are occasions where monies had been banked without being receipted and some instances where there are minor shortfalls between the amounts receipted and the amounts banked.

The bar account has been shown at net value only. The former Treasurer commenced writing up accountability slips each week, but this did not continue for the entire season. There is no evidence of misappropriation of funds from this source.

There has been as yet no opportunity to send the books to the auditor. This will be conducted as soon as possible and a full set of audited statements will be made available to members as soon as is practicable.

### NOTE 1 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the requirements of the Constitution of the New South Wales Australian Football Umpires Association Inc. The Directors of the Association have determined that the Association is not a Reporting Entity and that the Association's financial statements are not subject to the application of Accounting Standards and other professional reporting requirements, nor have these been applied, save to the extent that the accounts have been prepared in a consistent manner to previous years.

The statements are presented on an accruals basis from the records of the company. They are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current values of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which have been consistent with prior periods unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the presentation of these statements:

#### (a) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### (b) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax due to the application of the principle of mutuality.
