#### PRESIDENTS REPORT

Ladies and Gentlemen,

When I was drawn back into the Executive on the 22 March, I did so acknowledging that five Directors of the 2000 Executive did not seek re-election. Your current Board of Directors sought to consolidate and accelerate many of the ventures created by the previous administration.


Several goals were established, including

- the re establishment of a sound financial base
- the maintenance and extension of financial sponsorship
- establishing improved opportunities for umpires to represent their Association
- to create an improved social environment.

The embezzlement by the former Treasurer, which was discovered in early February, has been resolved. The misappropriated funds and all legal fees have been restored to your Association.

The valued support by the Westfield Corporation continued in 2001 with a 32% increase in financial assistance. Westfield has shown a wonderful commitment to Australian football umpiring in the past two years, however for reasons best known themselves, has decided not to continue their support for next year. Nevertheless, Westfield has injected over \$65,000 which has provided significant outcomes for your Association. Again, the Vili's company continues to support the NSWAFUA. I would like to acknowledge the injection of over \$1,200 by Thomas National Transport group with the advent of training T shirts. David Howlett is solely responsible for this initiative and next year promises to be even better. Your Association also benefited from financial injections by Lockwood (Ken Ray), Vintage Cellars (John Morris), Sportscover (Brian Woodhead) and Greg Young. Further, the Mark Rendell Shield winner won \$ 1,000 generously donated by Life Member, Bob Tait's Westside Wholesalers P/L. In all, the members of the Association benefited by an increase over 40% in sponsorship deals from last year.

On the representative scene, our members achieved many personal goals. Peter Barnes, Greg Lyons, Andrew Pearson, Steve Murphy and Greg Young gained selection to the senior AFL squad. I would like to single out Greg Young because of the huge endeavour and commitment that he has made over the years to reach this elite level of umpiring. Congratulations are extended to Adam Hoskins, Ben Parsons and Kyri Anagnostou for umpiring several TAC Cup games in Sydney and Canberra. Adam represented the Association at the Commonwealth Bank Cup in Melbourne, while Greg Rowan umpired the National Under 16 carnival in Adelaide. Well done. Wayne Hoskins and Steven Wallbank represented Sydney at the Sydney Football Association representative game in Newcastle. At the Sydney selection trials for the NSW State Under 15's at Campbelltown, Glen Callaghan, Tim Costley, Grant Godfrey, David Malone, Ken Ray, Greg Rohan, John Swenson, Owen Trevorrow, Serge Villagra and Greg Young represented the NSWAFUA. Glen Callaghan, David



Yole and myself represented NSW at the Australian Schoolboys Under 15 Carnival at Albury-Wodonga.

The work by Ipu Brown and her team, Steve and Jill over the home and away season and the finals series with contributions by Bruce Hunter and Matt Sheedy are truly appreciated. Thank you.

Last year I was appalled by the behaviour of some members of one grand final team, but this year was highlighted by the camaraderie and enthusiasm of all appointed teams. The whole season was characterised by diligence and conscientiousness by many members and this effort was reflected by the grand final appointments. No matter what the results (and they were generally expected) all games were conducted in the correct spirit and the fact that there was only one report for the grand final weekend reflects wonderfully on the professional abilities of all members.


The magnificent effort by David Howlett in achieving over 300 senior AFL games is amazing. David is an outstanding ambassador for all umpires and has given football preeminent service since 1982. His infallibility and promotion as a Life Member of the AFL is small reward for his great capacity to subsist in a highly competitive sporting world.

As a field umpire, it is difficult to understand how an individual can officiate in over 25 games every year since 1989. David Yole's accumulated 300 games in Sydney football excludes practice matches, school boys, school girls, womens and super rules games. A phenomenal achievement by an ardent advocate of umpiring who generates fervour and passion in this great game. Congratulations and sincere thanks from those who have been encouraged and invigorated with these great milestones by two honest achievers.

I was extremely pleased with the exchange with the Federal District Umpires Association. I know that Adam Hoskins, Ben Parsons and Kyri Anagnostou represented our Association with distinction and they have reported that the experience for them was invaluable. It is disappointing that Sydney cannot find billets for our counterparts as three of our members again had to back up from previous seasons.


While membership for the season remained stable, the attendance at social functions was the same as 2000, disappointing. Over 20 events were organised (BBQ's, New Tai Yuan, Star City, Double Bay 18 Footers, Lowenbrau Kellar, Royal Oak Hotel, Trivia Night, NRL Referees Night, Ten Pin bowling ...) and overall participation was dismal. In the future, your Board of Directors may have to curtail their energies and concentrate on only two or three events each year.

It is very exciting when members seek to contribute to the effective operations of the Association. Sometimes the tasks presented to these volunteers may not be what they initially sought, however, I fully acknowledge the resourcefulness and diligence of the following members: Nicholas Angelos, Greg Clarke, Tanya Provis, David Mitchell, Greg Rohan, John Swenson, Warren Tegg, Amanda Whittaker, Brian Woodhead and Greg Young. Thank you.



My fellow Board members have worked consistently and diligently all year. Steve Wallbank is to be congratulated for his tireless application and diligence, he is thoroughly deserving of the President's Award. The AW St. Clair Award is one of the Association's highest accolades and was deservingly presented to Andrew Smith. Andrew and Steve shouldered the burden of the Association, particularly during the off-season and have been tireless in their respective portfolios all year. To them and on your behalf a sincere well done and thank you. The new sponsorship initiatives in training and dress apparel were enthusiastically coordinated by Grant Godfrey. The design, manufacture and distribution is all his own work. Well done. Phil Lindley continued to manage post training refreshments with gusto and was always willing to have a chat. Thank you. Peter Hampshire and Darius Samojlowicz methodically and diligently managed the business of your Association with efficiency and thoroughness. The fact that this Association continued to accelerate and develop in 2001 is a reflection of their endeavours.

#### SECRETARY'S REPORT

It was with a great deal of pride that I accepted an invitation to become Secretary of the NSWAFUA after a four year break away from the Board. The year was always going to be a big challenge for the Board and it was extremely pleasing to have experienced members Mark Rendell, Darius Samojlowicz and Grant Godfrey return to lead the team.

The 2001 season was the second consecutive year that Australian Football in New South Wales did not have the services of a State Director of Umpiring and it was left to part time people to keep umpiring afloat. Numbers have been consistently falling over the last few years and umpiring has been suffering accordingly. From the 2000 year, 31 umpires who ran games during that season, did not return for 2001 and they were replaced by only 12 new umpires who were available on a regular basis. Obviously this rate of fall off cannot be allowed to continue. It is disappointing that since the end of the 2001 season no recruiting of any kind has been undertaken and it would seem that this year could have large gaps of games where no umpires will be provided.

The Secretary's Report from the 1998 season commented "Passive recruitment in recent years has seen numbers slip dramatically...." and "Recruitment, development and retention need to be urgently addressed by the newly formed AFL (NSW/ACT) and given significantly higher priority than the old NSWAFL." Three seasons have gone by and the impassioned pleas of the 1998 report have been ignored and in fact the situation now appears worse. The AFL (NSW/ACT) Commission has planned to appoint a new State Director of Umpiring from the 2002 season, however the selection has taken a lot longer than originally intended and the delay will no doubt affect umpiring this year.

A number of umpires showed outstanding commitment by doubling up and these umpires need to acknowledged. However, this only helped cover up the lack of numbers and the Association feels that in the long term doubling up should not continue as it affects the quality of umpiring and accordingly recruitment is critical.

On a more positive note the group performed extremely well throughout the year and in particular at finals time where umpires peaked with grand finals played in the right spirit with excellent control. Congratulations to all umpires who achieved their goals for the year. One umpire in particular performed at the highest level and was recognised for his efforts. Andrew Pearson won the Bill Sutton Award as the best First or Second Year AFL Boundary Umpire. Considering the competition around Australia, Andrew's effort was sensational and shows what can be achieved with hard work. In 2000, Andrew played in Sydney University's SFA Reserve Grade winning grand final team and came back to umpiring in 2001. He was observed by Jeff Gieschen early in the season and told he needed to improve his skills. The award proves he listened and plenty of practice paid off.

The spirit of the group during 2001 was extremely good and is a tribute to the determination of umpires will to succeed. The training track is the first place to observe the willingness of individuals to work towards improving themselves and



gives encouragement for the future. From a personal point of view, I must thank the umpires who regularly attended training and completed sessions without complaint (well at least with only the occasional sledge). The season consisted of around seventy training sessions and it is not easy to maintain enthusiasm, especially during the cold winter months.

To borrow from two previous Annual Reports, in 1989 it was reported that Grant Godfrey was the winner of the Junior Umpiring Scholarship. It is great to see that 12 seasons later, Grant is still umpiring and has now been in control of 2 senior Sydney Australian Football League Grand Finals, as well as a number of AFL Reserves, SANFL and representative games. The 1993 report advised that Mark Rendell would not be umpiring senior football in 1994 after 314 first grade games, as he was going to concentrate on the junior development of umpires coming through the under 18s. Of course a lot has changed in the world since 1993, however it is great to report that Mark came back to senior umpiring in 1997 and I have had the pleasure of being part of two memorable matches in recent years. Firstly in 1999, Mark umpired his 350<sup>th</sup> First Grade match and in 2001, he reached his 400<sup>th</sup> game. A truly remarkable achievement from a man who personifies umpiring in Sydney. Mark has umpired 155 more first grade games than any other field umpire in Sydney and it is a record I am sure will never be beaten. Congratulations Mark from all your friends in the Association.

Three other milestones deserve recognition. Ken Ray reached 400 and David Yole 300 total games for the Association to prove their dedication and of course, David Howlett became the latest AFL Life Member by completing 300 AFL games. These three gentlemen are an ornament to umpiring.

There are a number of people who need to be thanked for their efforts in 2001. My fellow board members (Mark, Darius, Grant, Stephen, Phil and Andrew) worked hard to ensure the Association survived a difficult time. The valuable sponsorships from Westfield, Vili's, TNT (through David Howlett), Bob Tait and contributions from Vintage Cellars (John Morris), Sportscover (Brian Woodhead), Lockwood (Ken Ray) and Greg Young, certainly helped the Association thrive financially and is gratefully acknowledged. The efforts of various members behind the bar, selling raffle tickets, helping with transport, billeting and generally keeping spirit high, continued to exemplify the character and strength within the group. It is of course disappointing that Westfield have decided not to continue their sponsorship in 2002, however it is hoped that they will return to support the Association in the future.

Finally, as season 2002 draws closer I encourage all members to continue to support the Association in it's endeavours. The Association exists to ensure it's members are looked after in all facets of umpiring from training, games, fiscally, travel, socials and general enthusiasm and the members are the image of the Association. Good luck during the year ahead.

Preparation of these statements have been compiled by KMN Accountants.



#### NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the requirements of the constitution of the New South Wales Australian Football Umpires Association Inc. The Directors of the Association have determined that the Association is not a Reporting Entity and the Association's financial statements are not subject to the application of Accounting Standards and other professional reporting requirements, nor have these been applied, save to the extent that the accounts have been prepared in a consistent manner to previous years.

The statements are presented on an accruals basis from the records of the company. They are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current values of non-current assets. The following specific accounting policies, which have been consistent with prior periods unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the presentation of these statements;

#### (a) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### (b) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax due to the application of the principle of mutuality.





#### **Constitutional Amendments:**

1. Moved Michael Heinrichs/Mark Rendell.

Referring to clause 24 (responsibilities of the Treasurer)

To insert new clauses:

24 (c) the provisions of clause 39 (b) are carried out.

Clause 39 (b) refers to the depositing of all monies received into the Associations bank account. 24 (d) a written report is furnished to the Secretary at all committee and members meetings detailing all receipts and payments made since the last report, together with a balance of funds available reconciled to the last statement of account received from the Associations bankers, a copy of which shall be furnished with each report.

Michael Heinrichs spoke for the amendment and then various members spoke for and against the amendment.

2 Moved Nick Angelos/Mark Rendell

Referring to Clause 5 (Membership).

To alter clause 5 (a) to read: There shall be FIVE (5) classes of members - life, active, junior, honorary and associate.

Previously there were 4 classes. This amendment creates a fifth - Associate.

To add clause 5 (f): Associate Members shall be persons recognised by the league as eligible for appointment as Field, Boundary or Goal Umpires (not being persons appointed only on an occasional, informal or emergency basis) who shall have made application and been admitted as provided in rule 8. Such members will not be eligible to vote during meetings or hold a position on the committee.

To amend clause 8 (b) to read: The committee shall, at it's next meeting after receipt of an application for membership, or after receipt of any further material required under sub-paragraph (c) approve or reject the application. The committee may also offer the applicant Associate Membership in lieu of the active or junior membership for which they have applied.

Mark Rendell spoke for the amendment and then various people spoke for and against.


Vote was then conducted on both amendments.


