Being able to have guests of the caliber of Ron Barassi, Andrew Demetriou, Ron Evans, Peter Hudson and several Swans players provided a huge boost to our profile and marked these occasions as highlights on the Sydney Football calendar. Thank you to all members who supported our functions and I'm sure the board will continue to host such functions in the future.

This season proved to be the start of a transition period in Sydney umpiring. Many new faces were seen on the track and ended up being provided with an opportunity to umpire at the highest level in Sydney football. The hard work done by David Yole and the coaching staff enabled many younger people to progress. If umpiring is to flourish then new faces need to be encouraged. A structured development plan is underway with the guidance of David Yole and Craig Davis. Secretarys Report

At the 2003 Annual General Meeting the Association entered a new era with after 27 years of involvement in Sydney football, Mark Rendell retired and the 2003 Board of Directors did not include his name.

Mark Rendell's absence was just one of the challenges facing the Association in 2003, a year which saw a number of new initiatives taken up and the group moving forward in a very professional manner. The Collective Bargaining Agreement signed in March 2003 meant umpires employment conditions were formulated for the 2003, 2004 and 2005 seasons. The CBA certainly made membership of the Association an essential part of umpiring with free uniforms, a massage facility at training and a free end of season function among other benefits, meaning the cost of joining the Association was returned to the member over and above the original investment.

The Association would not have been able to finance all the benefits without the assistance of Westfield Limited. Special thanks to Mark Ryan from Westfield for his help in supporting the Association.

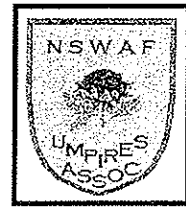
As 2003 was the Year of the Official, the Association decided to create an umpiring Hall of Fame incorporating 100 years of football in Sydney. A committee was formed to research the records of umpiring and twelve names were decided upon to be the inaugural inductees into the Hall of Fame. A very successful function was held in June when the twelve umpires were recognized. Such was the prestige of the evening that the Association's very good friend Harry Beitzel arranged for a number of distinguished guests to attend. The attendance by Andrew Demetriou and Ron Evans from the AFL highlighted the importance of the night and the Association was privileged to have these two high ranking football people present. It is hoped that the Association will be able to make the Hall of Fame dinner an annual event and establish a permanent highlight on the umpiring calendar. The Association is very fortunate to have Harry Beitzel as a friend and be able to use his connections to attract the caliber of guests who attended the Hall of Fame dinner and Presidents Night. Thank you Harry.

Another innovation that took place during the year was the move of the traditional Grand Final Night awards function from a Sunday evening to a Saturday evening two weeks after the end of the season. There is no doubt this was well received and ensured a big attendance.

Thank you to Grant for his leadership during the year and to Nicholas, Michael, Graham and Steven for their hard work. The Board was one person short after Tony McGilvray's health problems and put extra pressure on the Board. Hopefully 2004 will see more hands being available to help out.

In closing I sadly report the recent passing of goal umpire Fred Hopkinson. Fred commenced umpiring in 2000 and has had an involvement with our great game for a number of years. A jovial fellow, Fred will be sorely missed. Condolences to the Hopkinson family.

Treasurers Report

Firstly I would like to thank and acknowledge Tony McGilvary who was elected at the Annual General Meeting last year for his effort. Unfortunately health issues prevented him from umpiring and in turn from continuing in his role as Treasurer of the Association.

The 2003 was a year of consolidation and innovation for the Association to increase the profile of Umpires and the Association. With very successful functions such as the inaugural Hall of Fame Dinner, Presidents Night and Presentation Night, all were raising the profile of the Association in the football world. These initiatives placed a burden on the finances of the Association and thanks to the financial support of Westfield Limited the costs were largely offset. Without the support of Westfield Limited the functions would not have been the success they were.

The functions conducted resulted in the following surplus/deficit:-

Hall of Fame Dinner	\$3,796.81
Presidents Night	\$2,834.50
Presentation Night	(\$4,389.00)

A shrinking membership base (down 29.5% from 2002) contributed to the pressure placed on the finances of the Association as membership income fell \$3,110. The aim of the Association in 2004 is to increase the percentage of umpires who are members.

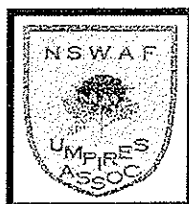
For the 2003 financial year accounting procedures have also been introduced to ensure the accuracy of the accounts and that audit trails of member's funds is in place.

As is the case every year the purchase of uniforms represents the Associations single biggest outlay of funds. This purchase supplies the demand of umpires not only in the Sydney AFL but also in the junior metropolitan leagues and the country leagues of New South Wales.

There are challenges ahead for the Association in 2004 including membership, the supply of uniforms, the cost of functions to members and sponsorship. It is important for all members to contribute for the overall success of the Association.

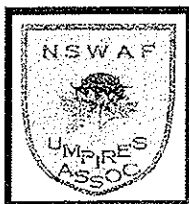
On a personal note I would like to thank the retiring Board for their wonderful work and tireless effort that goes on behind the scenes.

6. Constitution

A number of proposed amendments were received to the NSWAFUA Constitution that were moved by Rendell/Smith.

Amendment A

Some of the numbered sections of the constitution have titles and some do not. It is proposed to add the following titles to the numbered sections of the constitution as listed below.

Motion:

To alter the constitution of the NSWAFUA to add the following headings to the numbered sections of the constitution:

4. Membership
5. Classes of Membership
6. Affiliations
7. Conflict of Interest



8. Application for Membership
9. Life Membership
10. Insignia
12. Resignation of Membership
17. Right of Appeal
29. Special General Meetings
40. Application of Funds
44. Inspection of Books
47. Distribution of Surplus Property

Amendment B

This amendment is simply to update the definition of the term "League" in Section 1. Name and Definitions.

Motion:

To alter section 1 paragraph (b) to read as follows:

(b) "League" means the AFL (NSW/ACT) Commission or any successor controlling body.

Amendment C

This amendment refers to section 5. Classes of Membership, and removes the bullet point (a) from the first paragraph and alters the bullet points of the four following paragraphs from (b), (c), (d) and (e) to (a), (b), (c) and (d). In what would become paragraph (b) the word 'admired' is being changed to 'admitted' to correct a mistake in the wording. This change is highlighted and underlined below.

Motion:

To alter section 5 of the constitution to read as follows:

5. Classes of Membership

There shall be four (4) classes of members: Life, Active, Junior and Honorary.

(a) Life members shall be or have been active members who are qualified and have been elected as provided in Rule 9.

*(b) Active members shall be persons recognised by the League as eligible for appointment as field, boundary or goal umpires (not being persons appointed only on an occasional, informal or emergency basis) who shall have made application and been **admitted** as provided in Rule 8.*

(c) Junior members shall be persons who have satisfied the Committee that they have such prerequisite knowledge of the laws of Australian Football



and experience as an umpire as the Committee may from time to time prescribe.

- (d) *Honorary members shall be such persons who, not being eligible for active or junior membership, have been elected by the Committee for such a period of time as the Committee shall, at the time of election, determine.*

Amendment D

This amendment refers to section 16. Disciplining of members, paragraph (a) and corrects a formatting error in the wording and numbering of the subsections.

Motion:

To alter section 16 paragraph (a) of the Constitution as follows:

Remove the words 'the Committee may by resolution,' from subsection (ii).

Add the words 'the Committee may by resolution' as a separate sentence within paragraph (a).

Renumber subsections (iii). and (iv). as subsections (i). and (ii). underneath the new sentence within paragraph (a).

The final wording of the entire paragraph (a) of section 16. will then read as follows:

- (a) *Where the Committee is of the opinion that a member of the Association*
- (i) *Has persistently refused or neglected to comply with a provision or provisions of these rules; or*
- (ii) *Has persistently and wilfully acted in a manner prejudicial to the interest of the Association the Committee may, by resolution*
- (i) *Expel the member from the Association; or*
- (ii) *Suspend the member from the membership of the Association for a specified period.*

Amendment E

This amendment refers to Section 28. General Meetings paragraph (b) subsection (iv). and adds the word "Association's" to the first sentence, removes the word "Association's" from the sentence "Association's Income" and adds numbered subsections (i), (ii), (iii) and (iv) to each of the sentences



"Income", "Assets and Liabilities", "Mortgages, charges and other securities" and "Trust properties" respectively.

Motion:

To alter Section 28 paragraph (b) subsection (iv) of the constitution to read as follows:

- (iv) *to receive and consider a statement from the Committee which is not misleading and gives a true and fair view for the last financial year of the Association's*
- (i) *Income*
- (ii) *Assets and Liabilities*
- (iii) *Mortgages, charges and other securities*
- (iv) *Trust properties*

Andrew Smith spoke on the proposals.

Mark Rendell spoke on the proposals.

Ballot papers were distributed.

Les Gonye suggested section 18 "Powers of Committee" should be bold.
Mark Rendell stated there needs to be 14 days notice before AGM of any proposals.

Frank Kalayzich asked should members be notified 14 days in advance. Mark Rendell advised Constitution requires 14 days notice to the Board.

James McSweeney and Tony McGilvray were appointed scutineers.

Election took place.

Motions were carried – 25 For, 1 Informal.

There being no further business the meeting closed at 8.06pm.

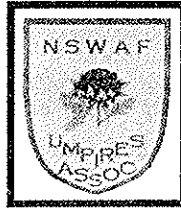
